

I want to thank you all for your support for the last 5 almost 6 years. Westminster Rotaract did not exist in 2016, and I worked with Brendan to rebuild it this club that fall and all through 2017. I ran-

domly ran into Jerika the first president of Westminster Rotaract at a Youthlinc event, and she gave me so much insight to Rotaract. After Brendan graduated in 2019, we realized that Westminster Rotaract needed to be recreated. We were able to do our Santa Flight in 2019, thanks to all of you. At that point we did not know how to "ask for help" and did not understand how a successful Rotaract club worked. One of our goals this summer is to train/prepare the incoming leadership team. The leadership team is divided into 3 current students & 1 alumni. Our board of directors is 3 alumni and 1 current student. Retaining members after graduation is often worrisome. I am proud that we have a total of 51 current members (not including the incoming members that have already signed up & will be added in the fall). This makes us the largest Rotaract club in the state of Utah. I have been reflecting a lot over the last few weeks after graduation, and the District Conference. Having this dual membership for Evan & I will strongly help Rotaract stay afloat. The autonomy given to Rotaract clubs is empowering, but overwhelming for college students. I would have been incredibly overwhelmed personally if I did not have the support from all of you! We have made the transition as easy as possible. We have a google drive full of templates for everything. Jared is working on an outline which he will share with you in August. I always say that we reflect our sponsoring Rotary club. Thank you all for all that you do to help us.

As I mentioned in my speech, and to many of you personally the dictionary from Sugar House was an integral part of my childhood. I had many friends learn brail and it all started from that dictionary. It truly means a lot to students. Our Lady of Lourdes was not diverse, but for first generation students like me, and two other friends having that dictionary was helpful. The three of us were not native English speakers even though we were born here. We also had the internet, but the dictionary was cool. I can't explain what exactly about it draws so many students to it, but it is loved. Jared still has his dictionary! It's how we both learned our state capitals too! I think it would really be beneficial to students in Title 1 schools that struggle with proper internet access. Evan also mentioned that he is more than happy to fly them on behalf of the club.

We would also love to have some dictionaries donated to Parowan Elementary School for the Santa Flight mission if possible. This is the Title 1 school that AFW has selected this year. The mission will be flown on Dec. 8th. Please let us know if it would be possible to donate some dictionaries to them. Thank you all again! I truly do consider each of you a part of my family. I did encourage other Rotary clubs to try and build that relationship with their Interact & Rotaract clubs during my morning breakout sessions.
