Erika Cohn grew up attending the Sundance Film Festival as a native Utahn, where she first began her career. Filmmaking has enabled Erika to travel the world- to places such as to Cambodia where she shot *Giant Steps*, a documentary about the reinstitution of art after the Khmer Rouge, which aired on PBS in May 2009.

Most recently, Erika associate produced the Frontline/American Experience series, ***God in America***, which aired in October 2010. Currently, she is producing/directing ***In Football We Trust***, a feature documentary about the rise of the Pacific Islander presence in the NFL and *Three Judges*, a feature documentary about the first female Shari'a law judges in the Middle East

Erika has received numerous accolades for her films, including a Director's Guild of America award for her film, ***When the Voices Fade***. She attended Chapman University in CA, where she graduated with degrees in Film Production and Middle Eastern Studies. In addition to ***In Football We Trust*** and ***Three Judges***, Erika is currently distributing the film ***Boys of Bonneville***.

In 2013 she served **Rotary International** as a **US Ambassadorial Scholar** to Israel/Palestine, where she taught film and began working towards her Masters in Middle East studies at Hebrew University.

The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship program will end in 2013. Beginning in 2013-14, The Foundation will offer scholarship opportunities through district and global grants. This new grant structure gives Rotarians greater flexibility in sponsoring the next generation of leaders.

The 2010-11 class of Ambassadorial Scholars received US\$9.6 million through individual grants of \$25,000. Since 1947, a total of \$532 million has been awarded to 41,000 men and women.

The Ambassadorial Scholarships program promotes international understanding and friendly relations among people of different parts of the world.

The scholarships sponsor undergraduate and graduate students, as well as qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as goodwill ambassadors to the country where they study and give presentations about their own culture to Rotary clubs and other groups. Back home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that deepened their understanding of another culture.

The Rotary Foundation has a rich history of funding scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study in a wide range of academic fields. Under Future Vision, the Foundation will continue to support scholarships through district, global, and packaged grants, which differ in their requirements and suggested timelines.



In a ceremony heavy with symbolism, RI President Sakuji Tanaka joined other Rotary and community leaders 17 May in laying a wreath in Hiroshima Memorial Park, dedicated to the victims of the atomic bomb dropped on the city during World War II. The subject of peace has been at the heart of Tanaka's year as Rotary's president.

Participants at the last peace forum adopted a declaration, "[Peace Begins With You](#)," which serves as a call to action for individuals to make a conscious effort in their daily lives to promote harmony with their neighbors and create friendships that transcend the divisions of nationality, politics, religion, and culture.

"Today, as we leave this last Rotary Peace Forum, I ask you to understand that peace, in all of the ways that we can understand it, is a real goal, and a realistic goal for Rotary," Tanaka said. "Peace is not something that can only be achieved through treaties, by governments, or through heroic struggles. It is something that we can find, and that we can achieve -- every day, and in many simple ways."

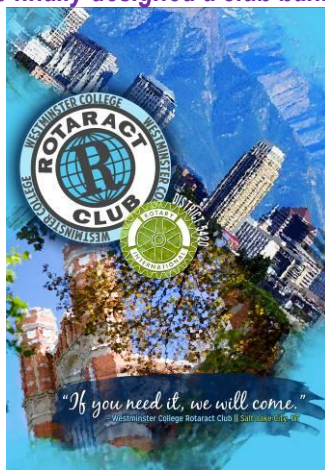
