Creed Archibald

Creed Archibald graduated from Westminster College with a B.A. in English Literature and later earned his M.Ed. from Southern Utah University. He's taught 7th, 9th, and 10th grade English for thirteen years between Oklahoma and Utah.

in December 2023, Principal Jeremy Chatterton reached out to Archibald



after learning that he had done debate in high school, inquiring if he was interested in taking on the position as Highland's new debate coach. As debate coach, he runs the class as well as does most of the administrative work for the team.

During class, Archibald mostly helps students prepare for upcoming tournaments and organizes them into groups so they can go over their speeches. He is also in charge of signing the team up for tournaments and finding judges for them. For every tournament, the team is required to bring a certain number of judges proportional to the number of stu-



dents they bring. Hopefully, he's through the steepest part of the learn-ing curve!

Archibald always loved the outdoors. He loved backpacking, skiing, fishing and just being in nature, but when he moved to Oklahoma about thirteen years ago, his options were limited. He found a small climbing gym called New Heights, which was not more than the size of a few Highland classrooms.

Since then he has climbed many famous climbs all over the western United States and Canada. Most notably, Archibald has climbed in Yosemite National Park, the climbing Mecca that all these climbing documentaries are set in. The specific climb that Archibald and his wife conquered was the park's most famous route, and the first route on El Capitan to ever be climbed, The Nose.

Despite already having a vibrant history of climbing amazing cliffs, Archibald still has more in store. Once school is out and he is no longer confined by his teaching schedule he is planning on taking a month-long trip to Africa to tame some routes on a global scale. He lives in South Salt Lake with his wife and sons and is working on another novel according to the Boutique Literary Agency.
