The Sugar House Chamber of Commerce  
brings together local businesses to enhance  
the economic vitality of our community  
through networking, events, collaboration  
advocacy, and opportunities for business  
development.

The organization has been fostering commu-  
nity relationships for nearly 70 years. Wheth-  
er it was known as the Merchants Associa-  
tion, the Chamber of Commerce, or by some  
other name, members of the business com-  
munity have been gathering together to cre-  
ate a sense of place in Sugar House since the  
late 1940's. The Chamber has brought Santa  
to the Sugar Shack for over 60 years, devised  
Sugar Days in April, Turkey Days in Novem-  
ber, and has used their funds to light the  
streets with holiday brightness throughout  
the season. Each 4<sup>th</sup> of July, they bring the  
Arts Festival ending the day with the annual  
fireworks display in Sugar House Park. When  
Sugar House was the furniture row of Utah,  
many of the stores banded together to co-  
market and co-brand their sales. This prac-  
tice remains today, with many of the local  
stores joining together for sales and events.  
The Chamber owes much of its history to a  
few local businesses, specifically Sterling  
Furniture and Smith Crown. The owners have  
cared for the community and kept the Sugar  
House traditions alive!
