Four Way Test slightly when he told the manager that he expected about 12 people to attend and socially distance.

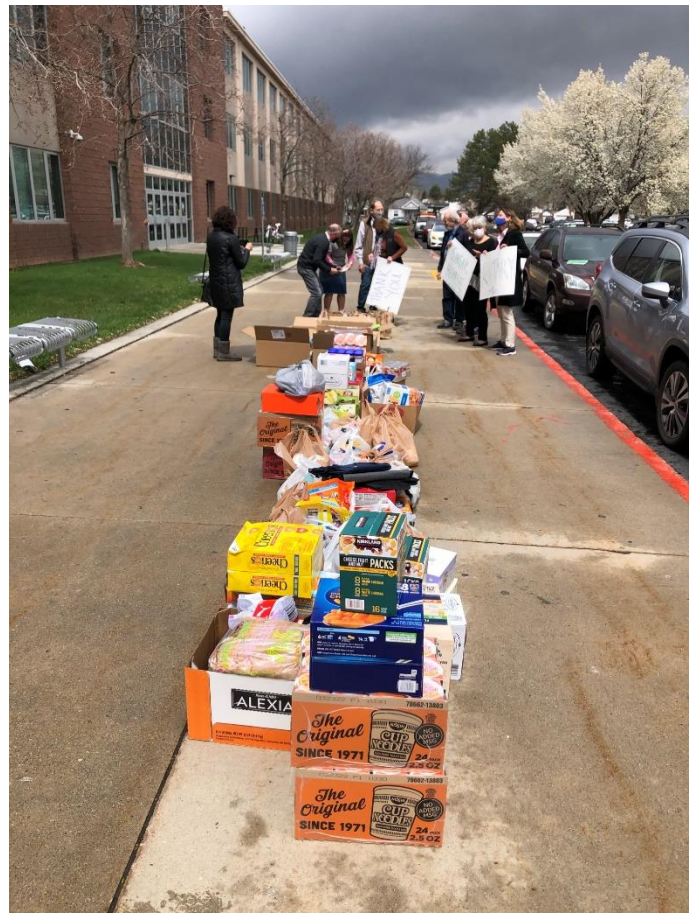
