Pamela Atkinson

Pamela Atkinson was born to a single mother in a slum area of London, England; became a registered nurse in the United Kingdom, and worked in the Torres



Strait Islands in Australia, before making her way to the United States. She earned a B.S. degree from the University of California, an M.A. degree from the University of Washington and worked in several states before coming to Utah as an employee of Intermountain Healthcare.



Pamela has spent the last two decades making a difference in the lives of the Utah homeless

and refugee populations. She currently serves on the State Homeless Coordinating Committee, Envision Utah, Utah

Coalition against Pornography and the State Refugee Advisory Board. She was appointed to the State Board of Regents for ten years, served on the State Board of Education and Utah College of Applied Technology Board.

Pamela initiated the Lincoln Family Health Center, which operates a clinic in a low-income school, the Intermountain Neighborhood Clinic and the Rose Park Family Health Center, another clinic in a low-income school.

She has been named an Advisor to Gov. Spencer Cox. A role she has had with three previous governors. Governor Herbert called her the Mother Theresa of Utah.

She works directly with homeless families and individuals, refugees and low-income families. In addition, Pamela collaborates with a variety of non-



profit and governmental organizations as well as agencies

who serve these populations.

Once inside, go up one level by way of the elevator or the broad staircase at the end of that hallway. At the top of the stairs you'll be able to see the party in the Richer Alcove/Tanner Atrium.

If the weather is good or parking on that level is full, you may prefer to drive up the ramp to the roof level of the parking garage. At this level, you can just go through the doors at the NE corner of the parking area, and proceed straight down the hallway to where the party is being held in the Richer Alcove/Tanner Atrium.
