Margaret Malherbe was born and raised in Johannesburg, South Africa.

She received her Diploma in Virology 1967. This was during her time when she worked at the Poliomyelitis Research Foundation in Johannesburg 1960-1974. While there she was in charge of the Safety Control of Oral Polio Vaccine in Cell Culture and Animals.

Later she was in charge of the Enteric Virus Unit. Many new viruses were discovered and are now prototypes and used world-wide in diagnosis.

She was invited to the United States of America in 1975 to continue Virus Research. While here she was employed at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio Texas. She served on the faculty of the Department of Microbiology and as a lecturer to medical, dental, and nursing students etc.

She also served as Chairman of the Dental School Asepsis Committee.

She moved to Utah in 1981 to join a private research group for research in rapid viral diagnosis. She was part of this group from 1981 to 1983.

Margaret has published many peer-reviewed scientific papers. She wrote a chapter in a book on Monoclonal Antibodies.

She co-authored a book on Viral Cytopathology with her husband, Hubert H Malherbe MD , MBBch. M Cambridge England, English Literature.

She served an appointment as a Trustee on the Board of the University of Utah Hospital for over 6 years.

From 1983 until the present she was worked as a consultant.

Asepsis: noun; the absence of bacteria, viruses, and other microorganisms.
