**Walter Jones:  
 Librarian Emeritus,  
 Marriott Library,  
 University of Utah**

Walter Jones is from Casper, Wyoming and once wrote a history of that city's early 20<sup>th</sup> century red light district, titled *History of the Sand Bar, 1888 – 1977*. In 1967, he graduated from the University of Wyoming after which he immediately joined the United States Army and became a Korean language interpreter, translator, voice-intercept operator, and interrogator.

Following his four years of active-duty experience, he attended Brigham Young University where he graduating from BYU with a master's degree in library science. Beginning a 42-year career as a librarian, first at Casper, then Evans-ton, Wyoming, he ended at the Univer-



sity of Utah's J. Willard Marriott Li-brary from which he retired in 2015. While employed as a librarian, he earned a master's degree in history from the University of Utah and also



enlisted the Army National Guard, eventually serv-ing in the Utah National Guard's premier language unit, first as a Ko-rean linguist and finally as the com-mand sergeant major for the 300<sup>th</sup>

Military Intelligence (Linguist) Brigade. Now, retired from both the Marriott Library and the National Guard, he teaches a variety of history classes for the University of Utah's OSHER, Life-Long Learning Program as well as for Salt Lake Community College for which he has taught at the Utah State Penitentiary for the past two years. In 1973, Walter married Helen Walker whom he met at Brigham Young University. Currently, Walter and Helen have two children and five grandchildren.
